Death Valley marathon run leads to 59-park photo trek

It all began with a marathon run in Death Valley.

One country, 27 states, two territories and 59 national parks later there was a book, "The National Parks of the United States."

When award-winning Australian landscape photographer Andrew Thomas visited four U.S. national parks in December 2007, he was mesmerized by their natural beauty. After two return trips within a year, he began a quest – to photograph all 59 parks of the U.S. National Park Service.

Over eight years, Thomas and his wife, Debbie, who now live on the island of Tasmania south of Australia, trekked 16 times across the continental United States, stopping to record the stunning beauty of Alaska, Hawaii, American Somoa and the U.S. Virgin Islands as well.

They spent as little as a half day in South Carolina and spent up to five days in Yellowstone, Thomas' favorite park, on their treks.

Thomas, also a graphic designer, completed the journeys in 2015 and decided to create a book which he designed himself. He then approached about a dozen

publishers, getting offers to publish from two of them. He had presented the book to them in its completed form which made the presentation easier for the publishers to accept. It was published in 2016, the 100th anniversary of the national parks.

Their travels were not always smooth, Thomas said. When in American Somoa his DSLR was doused by an ocean wave, destroying it, but only after he had gotten enough images to complete his job there. He continued on with an inexpensive underwater camera.

The pair took a boat ride before dawn to photograph a Hawaiian lava flow and Thomas, using a high ISO, had to perfectly coordinate his shots to the wave action to get a sharp image.

Thomas recounted his trips to the eight Alaskan parks, in some cases flying, ferrying or hiking to remote sites. Once, Andrew and Debbie, camping on a river bank, spotted a nearby bear watching them. The bear flinched first, diving into the river and swimming away to the other side, much to their relief. "We had a can of bear spray and we were pretty confident," he said.

"Some people never get to see (Mt. McKinley) at Denali," he said. So he and Debbie planned to visit over several days and the move worked when he captured a beautiful image of a bus winding its way across a plain in the direction of the mountain.

Thomas employs a Sony camera, having switched from Canon, and carries three zooms, a wide-angle, a standard and a telephoto. He said he uses the 24-105mm the most.

And a tip from the expert, "When you think it's finished, it's quite often not." When leaving a shoot, turn back to see if the light has changed and a better photo can be captured, he said.


