Battista urges members to think creatively

What makes an image creative?

Mark Battista, a nationally recognized painter and fine art photographer specializing in still life and portrait imagery, told members of the Springfield Photographic Society Sept. 25 a creative image inspires, informs and connects to the viewer emotionally. His purpose was "helping you think creatively."

And creativity is important because it enhances personal expression, differentiates your work from others, keeps your passion alive and will influence all genres of photography.

Content drives technique, Battista said. Content should be first on the photographer's mind. Then comes technique.

One approach he takes to creativity is to see similarities and differences in visual elements and combine them to communicate an idea. These can be found in form (shape, color, line, texture), function (how something is used), and animate vs inanimate objects (still vis active).

A braid in a native American's hair could be seen as similar to a twisted barbed wire, Battista said, as illustrated by one of his photos.

He urged members to play with ideas. One way to do this is to keep a notebook and write and/ or draw concepts. "Think like a child, be non-judgmental and let thoughts flow freely," he said.

Using the photo on this page where Battista combined a human form with a tree, he said to see similarities in the two subjects. The trunk merges into the model's back and limbs. To achieve this, he took a studio photo of the model and a tree trunk. He had to turn the fallen tree trunk to vertical and expand it to create a full trunk.



Keep working, he said, to create variation on the theme to challenge yourself. There can be multiple solutions to a problem. He said once he created three illustrations for an art director who chose two and told him to combine them into one. And it worked.

- "Do not wait for inspiration," he said.
 "Inspiration comes from putting in the work.
- "Creative people are not afraid to fail. They are willing to take risks."




